Pursuant to the New Jersey School Integrated Pest Management Act of 2002, the Paterson Public School District has implemented a School Integrated Pest Management Policy.

The Paterson Public School District's IPM Policy is in compliance with NJ State law and the district has implemented procedures to control pests and minimize exposure of children, faculty and staff to pesticides. The Paterson School District shall therefore maintain an IPM plan as part of the district wide policy.

IPM procedures will determine when to control pests and whether to use mechanical, physical, cultural, biological or chemical methods. Applying IPM principles prevents unacceptable levels of pest damage by the latest industry standards with the least possible impact to students, staff, property and the environment. IPM is a holistic, preventative approach to managing pests that is explained in detail in the schools IPM Policy which is located in the regulatory record center in each Paterson school and available for public review upon demand.

The IPM Plan is a blueprint of how the Paterson Public School District manages pest pressure through IPM methodologies. The IPM Plan states the District's goals regarding the management of pests and the use of pesticides. The IPM Plan is tailored to each school and reflects the school site specific needs. The IPM Plan shall provide a description of how each component of the Paterson Public School District Policy will be implemented at each school under the direction of the school principal as required by law.

The Paterson Public School District shall designate a District Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Coordinator, who shall be responsible for the implementation of the Schools' Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Policy. That individual, Steven Morlino, is licensed as a NJ Commercial Pesticide Operator in category 7A & 13 IPM in Schools. Also, each school shall have a School IPM Coordinator available on site. The district has trained and designated the Chief custodian as the onsite person. The site specific plan is managed and reviewed annually and signed off pursuant to law by the school principal. Additional information is available on the districts web site.

The school community will be kept abreast of and educated about potential pest problems and IPM methods used to achieve the pest management objectives. The Sector Supervisors have been designated as the overall administrator of the plan district wide and can be reached via the facilities office.

The School's IPM Coordinator under the direction of the school principal and other school staff involved with implementation of the District IPM Policy will be trained in appropriate components of IPM as it pertains to each school site. IPM services are provided through the services of a vendor (Pest-A-Side) for the 2017/18 school year.
