Applicants must complete the Amistad application and essay and provide all of the information requested to be considered eligible.

First preference will be given to applicants who commit to full training at their chosen institute. If there are extenuating circumstances, let us know on your application. Commuter applicants must select the commuter option on the application.

To be given full professional-development credit, candidates selected to participate must attend the full sessions for which they are registered. Partial attendance or daily visits are not permitted without prior authorization.
