5500 EXPECTATIONS FOR PUPIL CONDUCT

Code of Expected Student Behavior - Kindergarten through High School

Students, parent(s) or legal guardian(s), school administrators, and the Board of Education all agree that positive student commitment and behavior are essential effective learning. With the support and assistance of school personnel and parent(s) or legal guardian(s), all students can demonstrate actions which contribute to the effectiveness of schools and the worth of their learning experiences. All students, regardless of their age and ability, can behave in ways that enhance the social relationships of the school and facilitate learning.

Therefore, we the students, parent(s) or legal guardian(s), teachers, and administrators of this school district, expect all elementary students to fulfill the behavioral expectations of the school community and to:

- 1. Be respectful by:
 - a. Showing respect to everyone.
 - b. Avoiding the use of profanity and inappropriate language.
 - c. Being non violent in speech and actions.
 - d. Adhering to school rules and regulations.
- 2. Be trustworthy by:
 - a. Being honest and telling the truth.
