

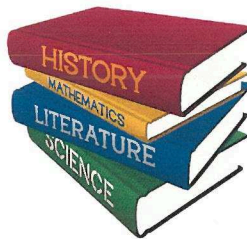
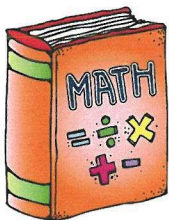

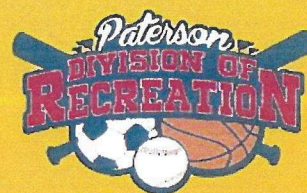

The program focuses on strengthening foundational skills in literacy and math while offering enriching, hands-on activities that make learning meaningful and joyful. For students in grades K–5, the program includes gardening projects that promote early literacy and science exploration, along with interactive math activities to build fluency and number sense. Students in grades 3–7 will engage in targeted instruction to develop key skills such as citing textual evidence, writing fluency, and solving complex math problems involving fractions, decimals, and equations. All students will benefit from high-quality instructional resources like Hands2Mind, Wonders, and StudySync. To complement classroom learning, the program includes educational field trips designed to broaden students' experiences and support their academic and social development.
